

Additional Eligibility Criteria and Its Rationale

For Admission to

P.G.D.A.V. College (Evening)

In deciding the cut-offs for admission to its various courses, the college will be guided by its constraints, the general level of applicants and its experience of teaching students. Admissions will be based on cut-offs decided on the basis of the average percentage obtained in one language and the best three of other disciplines. In addition there will be additional considerations these have been outlined below under the appropriate headings

B.Com (Hons.) and B. Com (P) courses. The college has no provision to teach Accountancy and Mathematics from scratch. Therefore the admission will not be offered to students who have not offered these subjects at the Senior Secondary (Class XII) level. It may be noted that the requirement of mathematics for these courses is not covered by subjects like business mathematics or commercial mathematics. In general, admission will be offered to candidates who have passed in the Commerce related papers such viz. Business Studies, Accountancy, Economics and Mathematics. For others there will be a drawback of approximately 5 percentage points, depending on the overall cut-off percentage.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics. We have experienced distressingly high failure and dropout rates. Academic aptitude in general and aptitude in mathematics are crucial with marks in Mathematics per se being important and will be specified other than the percentage for one language and the best three disciplines.

B.A (Hons.) Political Science. There will be a drawback for students who have not offered Political Science in school. This is because other students would not have had the relevant exposure to this subject. The extent of this drawback would be 3 to 4 percentage points

B.A (Hons.) Hindi. Proficiency in Hindi is crucial in this course. Hence marks in Hindi shall be specified.

B.A. (Programme). Mathematics shall not be offered as a discipline unless the student has offered the subject and passed in it in the senior secondary examination. Similarly Economics will not ordinarily be offered unless the candidate has passed in it as a discipline in senior secondary. We do not get sufficient students opting for Sanskrit hence a reduction of the admission percentage of 2 to 3 percentage points will be made to attract students, provided they have studied Sanskrit at least at the secondary school level

The Pass percentage of the students who have managed to get to B.A. III year is less than 50 percent. This is the case in spite of the fact that only a percentage of students who are admitted manage to get to III year. Even in Honours courses there is a high failure rate in first year. In view of this we provide a

drawback of 5 percentage points for student who include subjects such as Music, Dance, Fine Arts, Physical Education, Home Science etc which are based on human faculties unrelated to academic potential or are high scoring in which there is a disconnect between marks obtained in other subjects and these subjects.
