With reference to the University Notification No. Aca.I.2011-12 dated 19th April, 2011, the following decisions were taken by the Admission Committee in a meeting held on 04.05.2011 for admission process in the under graduate courses for the academic year 2011-2012.

1. All the guidelines notified by the University will be followed.
2. There will be two cut-off list. One for general category and another one for OBC category.
3. The college will provide 5% concession to all girl students. This is to promote and encourage more girl students. As of now college demography shows that there are only 25% of girl students in the college. The college has been giving concession at admission to the girl student for more than a decade.
4. Students with gap year for more than one year will not be given admission. This will be subject to verification of documents and undertaking from the student. The college believes that students with more than one year gap are engaged in some profession and by giving them a seat it denies a non-working student a seat.
5. No concession will be given for NCC and NSS. Concessions will be given on the basis of ECA. Admission will be given on the basis of the trial performance of the student evaluated by the Cultural Committee of the college. The decision of the Committee will be final.
6. 10% concessions will be given to students seeking admission in any course with Punjabi as one of the subjects. The students must have studied Punjabi at least till class X. There are limited seats and admission will be done on first come first serve basis. If seats were not filled, then they would be opened out for general category students.
7. For admissions under the sports category all guidelines set by the University will be followed.
8. Students will not be allowed to avail of two or more concessions simultaneously.
9. Maths with 50% marks in the XII class is compulsory for admission to B.Com (Hons.). Maths may not be counted as one of best four.

- 10 Maths is not compulsory for students from Commerce and Science streams for admission to B.Com.
- 11 For calculating the aggregate percentage of the best four subjects for admission to B. Com Hons and B.Com Pass the following subjects are to be considered as conforming:

Only one subject from the vocational stream will be considered for calculating aggregate for best four subjects. For all other non-conforming subjects 5% will be deducted from the aggregate.

3% deduction from aggregate percentage will be made for students seeking admission into B.Com (Hons) and B.Com from Non-Commerce streams. For students from the Humanities stream it will be compulsory for them to have studied Maths and Economics at the class XII level.

12. For admission to BA Hons courses the following subjects will be considered as conforming subjects in the aggregate for the best of four subjects.

<u>ACADEMIC STREAM</u>
ONE LANGUAGE
MATHEMATICS, PHYSICS, CHEMISTRY, BIOLOGY, ECONOMICS, ENGINEERING DRAWING, POLITICAL SCIENCE, HISTORY, GEOGRAPHY, BUSINESS STUDIES, ACCOUNTANCY, SOCIOLOGY, PSYCHOLOGY, PHILOSOPHY, HOME SCIENCE.

5% marks in aggregate will be deducted for all other non-conforming Academic and Vocational subjects.

Students seeking admission for English Hons and Hindi Hons should have studied the subject at the XI-XII level and English & Hindi Elective will be considered as a subject in the best of four. No Vocational subject except creative writing & Translations studies will be considered as subject while calculating the best four percentage.

In case of Pol. Science (Hons.) student who have not studied Pol. Science at XI-XII level will be considered under Non-conforming subjects and 5% deduction from aggregate will apply.

13 A. For admission to BA PROG the following criterion will be followed.

The following Academic subjects will be considered as conforming:-

MATHEMATICS, PHYSICS, MATHEMATICS, PHYSICS, CHEMISTRY, BIOLOGY, ECONOMICS, ENGINEERING DRAWING, POLITICAL SCIENCE, HISTORY, GEOGRAPHY, BUSINESS STUDIES, ACCOUNTANCY, HOME SCIENCE, FINE ARTS, COMPUTER SCIENCE, INFORMATICS PRACTICES, SOCIOLOGY, PSYCHOLOGY, PHILOSOPHY, ENTREPRENEURSHIP, BIOTECHNOLOGY.

5% deduction in aggregate for all other non-conforming and academic vocational subjects other than:

i) Creative Writing and Translation Studies

B. For students opting for the following BA Program Vocational Courses offered by the college

- a) Entrepreneurship and Small Business
- b) Office Management and Secretarial Practice
- c) Tax, Procedure and Practice
- d) Business Data Processing

one of the following vocational Courses will be considered as conforming in the aggregate for the best of four subjects:

- 1. Accounting and Auditing
- 2. Marketing and Salesmanship
- 3. Banking
- 4. Accounting and Business
- 5. Introduction to Financial Marketing

C. For students opting for Office Management and Secretarial Practice as a BA Program Vocational Courses offered by the college, the class XI-XII vocational course on

1. Stenography (English and Hindi)

will also be considered as conforming in calculating the aggregate for the best of four subjects.
