

### Economics

Admission to the B.A. (Hons.) course in Economics will be based on merit determined according to the average percentage secured in Class XII Examination in a combination of four subjects, with the subject combination defined by any of the following three categories:

**Category A:** One Language, Mathematics/Business Mathematics, and any two Commerce subjects (OR One Language, Mathematics/Business Mathematics, Economics, plus one Commerce subject).

**Category B:** One Language, Mathematics/Business Mathematics, and any two Science subjects (OR One Language, Mathematics/Business Mathematics, Economics, plus one science subjects) or any two Humanities subjects.

**Category C:** One Language, Mathematics/Business Mathematics, and any two elective subjects.

- The cut-off for respective categories will be intimated at the time of admission according to University calendar.
- The cut-off for Category A and Category C will be kept at 2% and 3% higher than Category B respectively.
- The cut-off for OBC categories will be lower than the General category cut-off for categories A, B and C and the difference will be intimated at the time of admission according to the University calendar.
- All four subjects shall be given equal weightage in determining a candidate's average percentage.
- A candidate must have secured at least 60% marks in English in Class XII Examination to be eligible for admission.
- The one Language that shall be considered would ordinarily be English or Hindi (Official Indian Languages of different states other than Hindi may be considered in cases where the candidate has studied the language in Class X and Class XII).
- The specific subjects that a candidate can consider as "Commerce", "Science" and "Humanities" in categories A and B respectively, and as "any two elective subjects" in category C will be determined as per university guidelines at the time of admission.

### **Justification**

- In the categories A, B and C, one Language and Mathematics/Business Mathematics is included as the course requires some degree of proficiency in Mathematics.
- The cut-off for Category A is kept higher to ensure parity amongst candidates from different streams, as the past experience shows that students from 'Commerce' stream tend to score higher marks than other streams in Class XII Examination.
- The cut-off for Category C is kept higher, again to ensure parity amongst candidates, as these subjects tend to have a higher practical component in examination and hence students tend to score higher marks in these subjects.
- The minimum marks in English in Class XII Examination is kept so that the students can cope up with the recommended texts which are in English.

### Political Science

**Category A:** One language + Political Science + any other two social science subjects. (One per cent less than category B. Two per cent less than category C. Three per cent less than category D).

**Category B:** One language + any three social science subjects. (One per cent more than category A. One per cent less than category C. Two per cent less than category D)

**Category C:** One language + any three subjects from science/ commerce streams. (Two per cent more than category A. One per cent more than category B. One per cent less than category D).

**Category D:** One language +any other combination of three academic subjects. (One per cent more than category C. Two per cent more than category B. Three per cent more than category A).

### B. A. (Programme)

**Category A:** One language + three social science subjects. (Four per cent less than category B.)

**Category B:** One language +any three academic subjects. (Four per cent more than category A).

### English

Admission to the B. A. (Hons.) English course will be done through a combined Aptitude Test for English (CATE), to be held under the aegis of the Department of English, University of Delhi. The test will evaluate candidates' aptitude for the course.

The criteria for appearing in the test will be

- (i) A minimum of 60% marks in English (Functional, Core, Elective, etc) in the school-leaving (Class XII examination),
- (ii) A minimum of 60% aggregate in the best 4 subjects (including English).

The CATE score will be calculated on 30:70 ratio of the Class XII aggregate marks: CATE marks.

SC/ST/PH/Foreign students are exempt from taking CATE and will be admitted as per the prevailing rules of the University.

OBC students will be given up to maximum relaxation of 10 on the CATE cut-off score, as determined by the respective colleges, at the time of admission only.

College will admit students from the CATE score list on the basis of cut-offs fixed by them respectively. There will be no centralized allocation of candidates to the different colleges by the University.

### Physics

Admission for B.Sc. (Hons.) will be based on merit to be determined from marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.

### Zoology

The criteria of admission for B.Sc. (Hons.) Zoology is aggregate percentage of Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Biotechnology in class XII.

### Botany

### Mathematics

Admission to B. Sc. (H) will be made on the basis of merit determined from the best four subjects according to the following criterion:

<b>Category-A</b>	English + Mathematics + any two subjects from Science/Humanities/Social Sciences.
<b>Category-B</b>	English + Mathematics + any two subjects from Commerce/Electives other than the subjects from the vocational stream of CBSE with 2% higher marks than Category A.

### Justification:

A - We require English as the medium of instruction is English, so certain level of proficiency is needed in the language.

B - On the basis of past experience, the students in Category B who come for admission to Hindu College tend to have more marks than the students in Category - A
