B.A. (Programme) (Minimum aggregate marks 40%)

- (1) One language out of Core / Elective / Functional Hindi / English / Sanskrit / MIL and three best Elective Subjects.
- (2) One Vocational Subject may be considered to determine the eligibility.

List of Vocational Subjects for B.A. (Programme)

Hindi/English Type Writing & Stenography, Office Communication/Office Practice & Secretaryship/Management & Secreterial Practice, General Studies, Travel Agency Operation, Marketing of Tourism, Library & Society & File Organisation, Advertising and Public Relations, Data Processing Techniques, Beauty Culture, Interior Decoration, Commercial Art/Fashion/Dress/Textile Designing, Dance, Music, Business Software, Painting, Sculpture Library and Information Science, IT Applications, Life Insurance and General Insurance.

B.Com (Minimum aggregate marks 40%)

1. One language out of Core / Elective / Functional Hindi or English and
2. Three best Elective Subjects out of Accountancy, Economics, Business Studies / Commerce / Business Org. Elements of Commerce; Statistics / Business Statistics; Maths / Business Maths, Computer Science, Informatics Practices and Entrepreneurship.

B.Com (Hons.) (Minimum Aggregate marks 45%)

1. One language out of Core / Elective / Functional Hindi or English and
2. Three best Elective Subjects out of Accountancy, Economics, Business Studies / Commerce / Business Org. Elements of Commerce; Statistics / Business Statistics; Maths / Business Maths, Computer Science, Informatics Practices and Entrepreneurship.
3. Minimum 50% marks in Mathematics / Business Maths.

Deduction of Marks for B.Com & B.Com (Hons.)

If a candidate has not passed Accountancy / Economics / Business Studies at Class XII level, the other elective subjects may be from the lists of Academic & Vocational Subjects given on page 3 & 4 and aggregate marks of the candidate shall be reduced by the % mentioned against the respective subject.

Only One Vocational Subject out of Office Management & Secretarial Practice, Accounting & Auditing, Office Secretaryship, Stenography (English/Hindi), Book Keeping & Accountancy, Purchasing & Store Keeping, Banking, Insurance, Taxation, Marketing & Sales Management, Store Accounting, Salesmanship, Principles and Practice of Life Insurance, Principles & Practice of Marine Cargo & Hull Insurance may be considered to determine the eligibility for admission if academic subjects are not available.

1.A. (Hons.) Economics

One language out of Core / Elective / Functional English and three best elective subjects.

Minimum 50% marks in Mathematics / Business Mathematics and English.

Minimum 50% marks in aggregate.

Hindi, Sanskrit, Other Languages and Vocational Subjects will not be considered.

1.A. (Hons.) Political Science

One language out of Core / Elective / Functional Hindi or English & three best elective subjects.

Minimum 50% marks in Political Science and Minimum 50% marks in aggregate. OR

Minimum 55% marks in aggregate if the candidate has not passed Pol. Science at Class XII level or has secured less than 50% marks in Political Science.

One Vocational Subject out of Journalism and Data Processing Techniques, Advertising and Public Relations may be considered.

3.A. (Hons.) History

One language out of Core / Elective / Functional Hindi or English & three best elective subjects.

2. Minimum 50% marks in History and Minimum 50% marks in aggregate. OR

3. Minimum 55% marks in aggregate if the candidate has not passed History at Class XII level or has secured less than 50% marks in History

4. One Vocational Subject out of Journalism and Data Processing Techniques, Transport & Tourism, Travel Agency Operations, Marketing of Tourism Public Relations and Communications may be considered.

B.A. (Hons.) English (Summary of CATE Guidelines)

Admission to the B.A. (Hons.) English course will be done through the Combined Aptitude Test for English (CATE), to be held under the aegis of the Department of English, University of Delhi. The test will evaluate candidate's aptitude for the course.

The test will be held on 9th June, 2010.

The criteria for appearing in the test will be

i) A minimum of 60% marks in English (Functional, Core, Elective etc.) in the school-leaving (Class-XII) examination, and

ii) A minimum of 60% aggregate in the best 4 subjects (including English).

The CATE score will be calculated on a 30:70 ratio of the Class XII aggregate marks and CATE marks respectively.

SC/ST/PH/Foreign students are exempted from taking CATE and will be admitted as per the prevailing rules of the University.

OBC students will be given a maximum relaxation of up to 10% on the CATE cut-off score, as determined by the respective colleges, at the time of admission. The College will admit students from the CATE score list on the basis of cut-offs fixed by it respectively. There will be no centralised allocation of candidates to different colleges by the University.

B.A. (Hons.) Hindi

1. Minimum 50% marks in Core / Elective / Functional Hindi or Minimum 70% marks in Core / Elective Sanskrit and three best elective subjects.
2. Minimum 50% marks in aggregate.
3. One Vocational Subject out of Journalism, Beauty Culture, Interior Decoration, Commerical Art, Advertising & Public Relations, Fashion / Dress / Textile / Designing, Vocal & Instrumental Music, Dance, Sculpture, Painting may be considered.

Note : Two languages i.e. Hindi & English (Core / Elective) can be considered to determine the eligibility for admission to B.A. (Hons.) in Political Science, History, Hindi & B.A. (Programme)

B.Sc. Physical Science and Applied Physical Science (with Electronics)

1. Minimum 45% aggregate marks in Physics, Chemistry and Maths.
2. The candidate should have passed in theory & practical separately.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT SCHEME

A maximum of 25% of the total marks in each course will be awarded based on Internal Assessment on a continuous basis. Internal Assessment marks will be shown separately in the marks sheet issued by the University. These marks will be added to the annual / semester examination marks for determining the division of the students.

Criteria for Internal Assessment :

25% of the maximum marks in each paper in undergraduate courses be assigned for Internal Assessment. The Criterial is as under :-

- (a) 10% weightage assigned to House Examination to be conducted by the college in the beginning of the third term.
- (b) Each student shall be assessed on the basis of written assignments/tutorials as well as on the basis of project reports/term papers/seminars. The 10% weightage shall be for such written assignments, and project reports/term/papers/seminars.
- (c) 5% weightage shall be given for regularity in attending lecturers and tutorials.
